Biographical/Historical Sketch

The Nashville Banner newspaper began publication on Apr. 10, 1876 and ceased publication Feb. 20, 1998.

Scope and Contents of the Collection

The Nashville Banner Reporter Reference Files, Davidson County Series has information about topics, places, organizations, and county government (including consolidated Metropolitan government) that received news coverage in the *Nashville Banner* newspaper, from the 1940s to the 1980s. Formats include press releases, brochures, booklets, reports, telegrams, clippings and magazine articles, and flyers. Quantity of materials is usually less than five items for each topic. Some items are photocopies.

All the materials in this collection were originally housed in the Banner Clippings Files, but were removed by library staff for preservation purposes. Thus, although the Banner Reporter Reference Files is a separate collection, due to its size, it nevertheless bears a very close relationship and indeed should be viewed as an extension of the Banner Clippings Files. Information in both instances was compiled and used by reporters at the Nashville Banner as references when writing about significant events of the time. Researchers are advised that due to its being a much more comprehensive

resource, the Banner Clippings Files will likely be a more useful and productive source of information than the isolated items to be found in the Banner Reporter Reference Files.

A few items of special note include: brochures discussing the proposed J. Percy Priest Dam site along with maps displaying location information; items about the DuPont plant in Old Hickory; policy information on use of deadly force by Metro Police (ca. 1982); and a staff schedule for Nashville Banner photographers and reporters during desegregation of local elementary schools (ca. 1960), filed under its original heading "Segregation."
